Soon, you will help protect customers from buying an out-of-state titled vehicle with a dirty title.

A couple of years ago, we brought you Title Check, the free TxDMV service that allows customers to see whether a Texas title is clean before they buy the vehicle. Coming in 2014, the TxDMV will fully participate in the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS).

With your help, Texans will use NMVTIS to make sure that a vehicle with an out-of-state title they want to buy has a clean title.

As every Tax Assessor-Collector knows, title fraud, the selling of stolen or salvaged vehicles to unsuspecting customers is a problem. Nothing is more heartbreaking than having to tell a fellow Texan the vehicle he scraped and saved for months for is stolen, and will be impounded by police. Or having to tell a single mother who was so proud of her new car purchase that it's worth thousands less than she paid for it because it's salvage. Don't let this happen to another Texan.

NMVTIS is required by the U.S. Department of Justice and administered by the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA). We encourage Texans to check the title of any vehicle they plan to purchase in NMVTIS.
