Subject: Proposed Rulemaking to Implement Senate Bill 1080, 89th Regular Session (2025)

The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles (TxDMV or department) is requesting advice from the MCRAC regarding felony offenses that are directly related to the duties and responsibilities of motor carriers to implement Senate Bill (SB) 1080, 89th Regular Session (2025).

Department staff will walk through the proposed rules and the discussion question below to get your feedback during the discussion and briefing section of the upcoming MCRAC meeting. MCRAC will also have an opportunity at the meeting to vote on whether to make formal recommendations to the board.

Discussion Item and Related Question:

Proposed amendments to 43 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 211, Criminal History Offense and Action on License, to implement SB 1080 regarding the automatic revocation of a motor carrier's certificate of registration under Transportation Code, Chapter 643 by operation of law.

Question:

Prior to the effective date of SB 1080 on May 27, 2025, Occupations Code, §53.021(b) automatically revoked licenses by operation of law without any action by the department following the license holder's imprisonment for any felony. SB 1080 amended Occupations Code, §53.021(b) to narrow the law so that a license is automatically revoked upon imprisonment only for specific felonies, including offenses that directly relate to the duties and responsibilities of the licensed occupation. For purposes of Occupations Code Chapter 53, a certificate of registration that the department issues to a motor carrier under Transportation Code, Chapter 643 is a license. Occupations Code, §53.001 and Government Code, §2001.003 define the word "license" as "the whole or part of a state agency permit, certificate, approval, registration, or similar form of permission required by law." The department must therefore define in rule which offenses directly relate to the duties and responsibilities of the motor carrier professions. This will determine the specific crimes for which imprisonment will cause automatic revocation of a motor carrier's certificate of registration by operation of law.

3	§211.23. Purpose and Definitions.
4	(a) The licenses issued by the department create positions of trust. License holder services
5	involve compliance with federal and state laws. License holders might engage in fraud, theft, money
6	laundering, and related crimes, and endanger the public through violations of environmental and safety
7	regulations. Many license holders provide services directly to the public, and certain license holders may
8	be predisposed to commit assaultive or sexual crimes.
9	(b) The definitions contained in Transportation Code, Chapter 643, the Penal Code, and the Code
10	of Criminal Procedure apply to this subchapter. In the event of a conflict with this subchapter, the
11	definitions contained in Transportation Code, Chapter 643, the Penal Code, and the Code of Criminal
12	Procedure control.
13	(c) The following words and terms, when used in this subchapter, shall have the following
14	meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.
15	(1) "License" means any certificate of registration issued by the department under
16	<u>Transportation Code, Chapter 643.</u>
17	(2) "Retail license types" means for-hire motor carriers, but does not include private
18	motor carriers who transport cargo for which the motor carrier is the owner or lessee; or private motor
19	carriers who provide transportation for passengers at no charge.

1	§211.25 Criminal Offense Guidelines.
2	(a) Under Occupations Code, §53.021(b)(1) through (4), a license holder's license is
3	automatically revoked on the license holder's imprisonment.
4	(b) The department has determined under the factors listed in Occupations Code, §53.022 that
5	offenses detailed in subsection (c) of this section directly relate to the duties and responsibilities of
6	license holders under Occupations Code, §53.021(b)(1)(A). Such offenses include crimes under the laws
7	of another state, the United States, or a foreign jurisdiction, if the offense contains elements that are
8	substantially similar to the elements of an offense under the laws of this state, except as otherwise
9	stated in this subchapter.
10	(c) The list of offenses in this subsection is intended to provide guidance only and is not
11	exhaustive of the offenses that may relate to a particular licensed occupation. After due consideration of
12	the circumstances of the criminal act and its relationship to the position of trust involved in the
13	particular licensed occupation, the department may find that an offense not described below also
14	renders a person unfit to hold a license based on the criteria listed in Occupations Code, §53.022.
15	(1) The following felony offenses apply to all license types:
16	(A) offenses involving fraud, theft, deceit, misrepresentation, or that otherwise
17	reflect poorly on the person's honesty or trustworthiness, including an offense defined as moral
18	turpitude;
19	(B) offenses involving forgery, falsification of records, perjury;
20	(C) offenses involving the offering, paying, or taking of bribes, kickbacks, or

other illegal compensation;
