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PROCEEDINGS

MR. BACARISSE: Good afternoon. My name is Charles Bacarisse, and I'm pleased to open the Board meeting of the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles. It is 1:02 p.m., and I am now calling the Board meeting for May 18, 2022, to order.

I want to note for the record that the public notice of this meeting, containing all items on the agenda, was filed with the Office of Secretary of State on May 10, 2022. Before we begin today's meeting, please place all cell phones and other communication devices in a silent mode. And please, as a courtesy to others, do not carry on side conversations or other activities in the meeting room.

I want to welcome those who are with us for today's Board meeting. Face coverings and social distancing are not required at this meeting.

And if you wish to address the Board or speak on an agenda item during today's meeting, please complete a speaker's sheet at the registration table or send an email to GCO_General@TxDMV.gov. Please identify in your email the specific item you're interested in commenting on, your name and address, and whether you're representing anyone or speaking for yourself. If your comment does not pertain to a specific agenda item, we will take your

comment during the general public comment portion of the meeting.

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In accordance with department administrative rule, comments to the Board will be limited to three minutes. To assist each speaker, a timer has been provided. The timer light will be green for the first two minutes, yellow for one minute, and then red when your time is up.

Individuals cannot accumulate time from other speakers. Comments should be pertinent to the issues stated on the comment sheet, and when addressing the Board, please state your name and affiliation for the record.

There are few things that will assist us in making the meeting run smoother and also assist the court reporter in getting an accurate record: please identify yourself before speaking, speak clearly, do not speak over others, and please ask the chairman to proceed and be sure to get recognized before speaking.

1	Before we begin today, I'd like to remind all

10	Board members. Please respond verbally when I call your

13	MR. ALVARADO: Here.

17	MS. McRAE: Here.

19	MS. OMUMU: Here.

23	Member Ramirez will be here shortly; I think he
24	is stuck in traffic.

MR. SCOTT: Here. 1 2 MR. BACARISSE: And let the record reflect that 3 I, Charles Bacarisse, am here too. We have a quorum. Also let the record reflect that Board Member 4 5 Gillman will be absent today. 6 Now let's move to agenda item 2, the pledges of 7 allegiance. Please, let's all stand and honor the country and our state with pledges of allegiance, and I want to 8 9 turn it over to Member Prewitt to lead us in the U.S. 10 Pledge. 11 (The U.S. Pledge of Allegiance was recited.) 12 MR. BACARISSE: Member Ramirez was going to 13 lead us in the pledge to the Texas flag, but why don't we 14 all just jump in and do it. 15 (The Texas Pledge of Allegiance was recited.) 16 MR. BACARISSE: Thank you all. Please be 17 seated. At this point I would like to move to chair 18 19 reports, but I don't have one, so that takes care of 20 agenda item 3. Let's move to agenda item 4, and I'll turn it 21 22 over to Acting Executive Director Daniel Avitia for agenda 2.3 item 4.A. 24 MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Chairman. 25 Chairman, members, for the record, Daniel

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Avitia, acting executive director.

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I'm very pleased to report on the department's progress and accomplishments related to our ongoing efforts to combat the misuse and abuse of Texas temporary tags. The department has made significant progress since our last meeting and I'm happy to report that information.

MR. BACARISSE: Let me just note for the record that Member Ramirez has arrived. He was delayed by traffic, which we can all understand.

So welcome, Member Ramirez.

MR. RAMIREZ: Thank you.

MR. BACARISSE: We are on agenda item 4.A. The executive director is in the midst of a report to us.

MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Chairman.

Members, as you are aware, there are two components to House Bill 3927 which have been in place since February of this year and immediately began reducing access to fraudulent temp tags.

The first tool was the ability to place an annual limit on the number of temporary tags available to each individual licensee in the state. This process is working smoothly for the department, as well as our licensees. The tag limit system enhancements allow for our staff to monitor temporary tag activity and identify unusual activity for investigation more quickly.

The second major part of House Bill 3927 provided for the department's ability to immediately shut off dealer access to the eTAG system when fraudulent or suspicious activity is identified. To date we have used this ability to revoke the eTAG to 50 licensees.

Subsequent review of these dealers continues to show that their ability to engage in fraudulent activity has been significantly curtailed by the imposition of dealer-specific tag limits and the department's action to identify and prevent further abuse.

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The next big step, Chairman and members, on this effort is the implementation of fingerprinting requirements for licensees throughout the State of Texas. The rules implementing this process were posted for public comment on April 22 and are currently under required external review by the State's Regulatory Compliance Division.

We have simultaneously been working very efficiently with the Department of Public Safety on the backside of things to develop and implement requirements following the Board's approval of the rules. We believe this initiative can be operational this summer.

We also have made progress on the work of our law enforcement partner side to develop better processes for the request and provision of motor vehicle data used

in law enforcement investigations and enforcement actions.

Three separate initiatives are being implemented this

month and into June to improve the request process.

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First, we've hired several employees to create a centralized law enforcement contact center which will be operated out of the Enforcement Division. This contact center will provide a centralized point of contact for law enforcement officers and will be staffed with analysts familiar with motor vehicle data and the mechanisms to process data requests.

The team will credential law enforcement officers for data access, guide them through the most efficient process available, and assist with the identification of useful information for the specific investigation. The team is expected to be in place by mid June.

Second, once credentialed, law enforcement officers can also gain access to the TxDMV closed data portal where they can directly access regularly updated motor vehicle data sets through a web-based system available 24 hours, seven days a week. The team has been working with law enforcement representatives to identify the most useful initial data sets to make available through this closed data portal.

Third, and finally, we continue working very

cooperatively with the Department of Public Safety to make the TxDMV motor vehicle data available to law enforcement through the State Fusion Center. We have participated in productive discussions and coordination meetings with DPS to provide detailed information on TxDMV systems and related motor vehicle data and proceeding forward with this initiative through DPS very well.

A number of additional temporary tag projects remain underway, such as system security enhancements and research into redesign options, and we expect to have further progress and updates for you in the very near future, Chairman and members. The entire department remains committed to providing quality services to the motor vehicle public statewide.

Chairman, this concludes my remarks on this item. I'm happy to answer any questions.

MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Mr. Avitia.

Members, are there any questions on this report, comments?

(No response.)

MR. BACARISSE: I'm just curious, Daniel, as you open the law enforcement -- I'm not going to use the right term, it's not the Fusion Center but it's the -
MR. AVITIA: The law enforcement contact

25 center.

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1	MR. BACARISSE: Contact center.
2	MR. AVITIA: Yes, sir.
3	MR. BACARISSE: Is there a way to kind of pilot
4	that a little bit so that we make sure that when you
5	really open it wide that it's working like it should?
6	MR. AVITIA: Yes, sir. So the plan is very
7	much to pilot that with a subset group of law enforcement
8	officials not just the law enforcement contact center
9	but also the closed data portal so that we make sure
10	that it is exactly what law enforcement needs. And if
11	not, then we tweak it from there and make changes.
12	Great question. Thank you.
13	MR. BACARISSE: I think that's important, that
14	when we do open it wide that it works exactly as we
15	anticipated and law enforcement needs.
16	MR. AVITIA: Absolutely, yes, sir. Thank you.
17	MR. BACARISSE: That's great.
18	Members, any other questions?
19	(No response.)
20	MR. BACARISSE: Aline, is there anyone here to
21	comment on item 4.A publicly?
22	MS. AUCOIN: For the record, Aline Aucoin,
23	acting general counsel for the Texas Department of Motor
24	Vehicles.
25	David Kohler is here to comment on agenda item

1 4.A. 2 MR. BACARISSE: Oh, great. 3 Okay, Mr. Kohler, please come forward. Good 4 afternoon. 5 MR. KOHLER: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman, 6 Madam Chair, Board members. Thank you for allowing me to 7 be here today. Again, David Kohler, Central Texas law enforcement, and I'm here representing myself. 8 9 All I wanted to do was give another opportunity 10 to thank staff and thank this Board for the light years 11 that y'all have left in the last three to four months, 12 compared to the last several years on all of these items, 13 and it's very appreciated. So that's my comments. 14 MR. BACARISSE: We appreciate that, and we're 15 glad to see this progress like you are. 16 And I do want to thank this whole team, from 17 Daniel to everybody, for grabbing this bull by the horns and getting it to the point where we're about ready to 18 19 turn it on so then the work comes with making it work 20 right. So the job is not done, but we're making progress. 21 MR. KOHLER: Correct. Thank you so much. 22 MR. BACARISSE: You bet. 2.3 MS. McRAE: Thank you. 24 MR. BACARISSE: Aline, any other public comment

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on this agenda item?

MS. AUCOIN: Aline Aucoin, for the record. 1 2 No one else is here in person to comment on 3 agenda item 4. 4 MR. BACARISSE: Okay. Thank you. 5 Let's move to agenda item 4.B, if we may, 6 please. 7 MR. AVITIA: Chairman, thank you. Again, Daniel Avitia, for the record. 8 9 Chairman, I want to recognize the efforts of 10 our Motor Carrier Division, MCD. Earlier this month at the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators 11 12 Region II Conference, TxDMV was recognized and won both a 1.3 regional and international security award for 2022 in the 14 category of fraud prevention and detection award for the 15 motor vehicle agency and for the motor carrier safety 16 improvement process. 17 AAMVA's security awards recognize achievements and safety improvement processes. The award will be 18 19 presented to the TxDMV this September at the Annual AAMVA 20 International Conference in Baltimore, Maryland. 21 As background, MCD undertook a two-stage 22 programming effort to enhance the safety and fraud 2.3 prevention features of the state's oversize and overweight 24 permitting system, the Texas Permitting and Routing

Optimization System, known as TxPROS. Motor carriers

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1	applying for a permit to transport oversize and overweight
2	loads are now denied that permit if the carrier has been
3	placed out of service for safety reasons by the Federal
4	Motor Carrier Safety Administration or the Texas
5	Department of Public Safety. As of April 27, 2022, the
6	new security enhancement has denied permits to 48 carriers
7	who were found to be out of service, while at the same
8	time over 472,000 permit applications passed the screening
9	process.
10	Members, please join me in congratulating the
11	Motor Carrier Division on this achievement.
12	MR. BACARISSE: Well done.
13	(Applause.)
14	MR. AVITIA: Chairman, members, this concludes
15	my remarks on agenda items 4.A and 4.B as they relate to
16	the executive director's reports. Thank you.
17	MR. BACARISSE: Great. Thank you. I
18	appreciate that.
19	Members, any questions on item 4.B?
20	(No response.)
21	MR. BACARISSE: Let me mention that even though
22	we have public comment listed as agenda item 7, we're
23	going to take up the public comment period before we go
24	into executive session.

So let me ask General Counsel Aline Aucoin, are

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there any comments signed up from the public to speak? 1 2 MS. AUCOIN: Aline Aucoin, for the record. 3 There are no comments -- no one has signed up 4 to comment on the public comment section. 5 MR. BACARISSE: Okay. Very good. Thank you. 6 In that case, we'll now take up agenda item 7 number 5 and we're going to go into closed session. It is now 1:17 p.m. on May 18, 2022. We will go into closed 8 9 session under Texas Government Code Section 551.071, 551.074, 551.076, and 551.089. 10 11 For those of you in the audience, I anticipate being in closed session for approximately four hours, and 12 13 we will reconvene in open session after that. 14 With that, we are now recessed from this public 15 meeting and we're going into closed session. 16 (Whereupon, at 1:17 p.m., the meeting was 17 recessed, to reconvene this same day, Wednesday, May 18, 2022, following conclusion of the executive session.) 18 19 MR. BACARISSE: It is now 4:54 in the 20 afternoon, and the Board of the Texas DMV is now back in 21 session, open session. 22 Before we move on to the next agenda item, I'd 2.3 like to provide a few comments regarding the decorum of 24 this meeting. 25 I mean, it's all family here, but do I need to

read this, Aline? 1 2 MS. AUCOIN: No. 3 MR. BACARISSE: Thank you. Let the record reflect I've been given permission by the interim general 4 5 counsel not to read my scripts. Very good. 6 The Board will now take up agenda item 6, 7 Action items from closed session, and the chair would 8 entertain a motion on agenda item 6.A, if there is one. 9 Is that you, Member Graham? 10 MR. GRAHAM: That must be me. I thought I was 11 6.B, so I wasn't sure what was going on 6.A, or A and B. I was a little unclear. 12 1.3 MR. BACARISSE: Well, we're going to do A and B 14 together, the two motions together, one motion. 15 MR. GRAHAM: Mr. Chairman and illustrious 16 members of the Board, I move that the Board appoint Daniel 17 Avitia as the executive director of the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles at a salary of \$210,850 per year, 18 19 effective upon acceptance of the offer and contingent on 20 satisfying all TxDMV human resources requirements. 21 Department staff is directed to the necessary actions to 22 implement the actions authorized by this motion. 2.3 MR. BACARISSE: We have a motion from Member Is there a second? 24 Graham. 25 MR. PREWITT: Second.

1	MS. McRAE: Second.
2	MR. BACARISSE: There are multiple seconds.
3	I'm going to give it to Prewitt, but I'll write your name
4	down too.
5	MS. McRAE: All right.
6	MR. BACARISSE: We have a motion and a second.
7	Is there any further discussion on this item?
8	MR. GRAHAM: Mr. Chairman.
9	MR. BACARISSE: Member Graham.
10	MR. GRAHAM: I'd just like to say that I really
11	appreciate the efforts of the interim executive director
12	through a very difficult time period and really great
13	work, and great work by the team as we continue to get our
14	hands around this crisis. So thank you.
15	MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Member Graham.
16	MR. BACARISSE: I think that is widely held and
17	much echoed.
18	MR. SCOTT: Mr. Chairman.
19	MR. BACARISSE: Yes, Member Scott.
20	MR. SCOTT: In addition to the interim
21	executive director, I'd like to just call out our deputy
22	executive director during this time. Shelly, I think, has
23	done a great job for us and I appreciate that. And it's
24	been one of those times and her hanging in there with the

Board and with the agency, her support and her loyalty I

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appreciate and acknowledge.

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MR. BACARISSE: Indeed. Very professional and very much appreciated, Shelly. Thank you.

And I've said this before but I'll say it again as well, since we're passing around thank yous. A big thank you to Aline Aucoin and her stepping into the role as interim general counsel and helping manage this group and the agency in this time. Thank you, and much, much appreciation. Thank you for your professionalism.

Is there any further discussion on this motion? Yes, Member Ramirez.

MR. RAMIREZ: I'd like to echo everybody else's sentiments. I think you've done an incredible job stepping in to a very, very tumultuous time. And your spirit of collaboration working with all the department heads, working with all the stakeholders, it's not a very easy thing to do. It's a very heavy lift.

And so I hope that you take this gesture as our commitment to you as our ED going forward. So I'm very supportive of the motion, and we're very lucky and fortunate to have you here.

MR. AVITIA: Thank you very much, Member Ramirez.

MR. BACARISSE: Any further comments? Member McRae.

MS. McRAE: I will just say, since we're 1 2 already in five o'clock traffic anyway. 3 (General laughter.) Daniel, I just would like to tell 4 MS. McRAE: 5 you what a pleasure it has been working with you in this 6 position and to all of the DMV members out here. This has 7 been a rough time and y'all have absolutely rose to the 8 top, and not only working with the Board and all of your 9 stakeholders but also pulling in the law enforcement, 10 which was missing. 11 That was something that is crucial to the 12 overall success of this agency. And so I appreciate all 13 of your efforts by you and your team to pull them into 14 this and to get all of this straightened out. Y'all have 15 accomplished so much in a very short period of time. 16 And we know there's even greater changes on the 17 horizon, and so just kudos to you and the whole DMV team out here. 18 19 MR. BACARISSE: Hear, hear. 20 MS. McRAE: Really appreciate you. 21 MR. AVITIA: Thank you, Vice Chair, very much 22 appreciate it. 2.3 MR. BACARISSE: Well said. 24 Members, any other comment? 25 (No response.)

1	MR. BACARISSE: Hearing none, I will call for
2	the vote, please. Answer when I call your name.
3	Member Alvarado?
4	MR. ALVARADO: Aye.

5	MR. BACARISSE: We are very thankful for that
6	and now we have a lot more work to do.
7	As we adjourn, I want to ask, members, if we
8	could gather for a photo with the new executive director.
9	So if anybody has got an phone look at that, Carrie is
10	ready.
11	So at this point, unless there's any further
12	business, I would entertain a motion to adjourn.
